Health Freedom and Peace - The Key to a Sovereign Nations Foreign Policy

An Open Letter to the Conference of Sovereign Nations

At The Crossroads

I have been professionally engaged in the defense of first principles in the United States since 2003 when I joined Dennis Kucinich's Presidential Campaign. But I redoubled my efforts in 2019, when it became obvious to me that our very biology and health is the new battlefield between the Deep State and Humanity. The eugenics advocates are back, but in stealth mode.

The Chinese have articulated the strategy as biological dominance. But our actions as a nation were no better - until President Trump's victory in 2024. This is indeed largely because the Deep State, Senior Democratic Leadership, and the Chinese Communist Party are now one problem.

They are the proximate cause of the international crisis today.

But it has a long history, and Germany has been a big part of it.

Ich bin ein Berliner

It was a bright day in August of 2020 when the German people stood up in a flash of brilliance for which they have not yet been fully recognized.

Germany has the distinction of hosting the largest single rally against the lockdowns on planet Earth.

Something like one million people flooded into Berlin, and - sixty years later - gave President Kennedy's nephew, Robert, another opportunity to speak for the free world.

And this time, it was Bobby Kennedy's own nation that was censoring his struggling voice, refusing to acknowledge his leadership on the now mission-critical issue of health freedom. And the German people were risking their own freedom to put him on stage. Given their history, I was not surprised, but I was very impressed.

So I visited Germany this past summer, and was present for the final day of the trial of Michael Ballweg, the primary organizer of that rally in Berlin. He was in pre-trial detention for nine months, and then subjected to something like 50 full days in court while debanked and censored. With Secretary Kennedy at the helm, health freedom work in the United States had been moving forward steadily, but then the voice of history practically shouted at me to speed things up.

News came this past fall that the German government is planning to re-tool its automobile factories to make tanks for the military. Recruitment notices went up in their streets for the first time since World War II. At that point, I realized something was terribly wrong. The

masters of war are once again on the march, despite the obvious insanity of a rematch between Germany and Russia. It seems as if the lessons of history have once again been lost on a world struggling to distance itself from a past so horrible that amnesia seems preferable to another confrontation.

So I radically accelerated my efforts, not just with the health freedom movement in Germany, but with its political leadership, and urgently introduced some of their most active members to Secretary Kennedy. His X post on the issue electrified the German-speaking world with over 5 Million impressions on X, most of them in German speaking regions, and wall to wall coverage in the German mainstream press.

Enter Beat Zirpel, the man who had first introduced me to Michael Ballweg. Beat became central to my efforts, because he is one of the primary campaign strategists for the AfD. He is their social media strategist, and despite the party's enormous popularity, the AfD is treated as if there is a State obligation to censor it. So Beat's social media role has been critical to AfD's ability to get the message out about who they really are. And that's important, because the AfD is nothing like the right wing in Germany last century.

In fact, part of the impetus for accelerating and deepening the relationship between the health freedom and peace movements arose when I saw that of all the parties in Germany, only AfD is against the war with Russia.

At that point, any concern I had that AfD was a Nazi party evaporated. You can hardly be a German Nazi if you are against military buildups and don't want to invade Russia. These days, the real Nazis are on the side of Ukraine.

I have been honored to host Germans who refused to get the shot as well as members of AfD in Washington. It is clear they seek closer collaboration with American conservatives, Secretary Kennedy, and the Administration.

They have few options to achieve justice and accountability in their own country, and so even the little the Secretary and I have been able to do has been a lifeline for the doctors in prison, and for the thousands of doctors, nurses and other professionals prosecuted relentlessly for protecting their patients, friends, and family.

I will admit my motivation is in part selfish. I do not want to see another war destroy European culture and families, but I especially do not want to see the United States of America dragged into Europe's ancient quarrels again. And for that reason, I will spare no effort to stop it.

My work involves piecing together individuals, small groups, experts, associations, and developing alignments of interest toward effective action. I am at heart a grassroots organizer. In Germany now and during the last US Administration, there was no other way to move forward, because the institutions had become the enemy of the people. That said, President Trump's effort to make peace with Russia has been most encouraging to this child of the Cold War. I have lived with the threat of nuclear war for my entire life. To drive Russia

into an alignment with China has been such a fundamental foreign policy error that even Kissinger questions it.

The Trump Administration's National Security Strategy is also encouraging. With its direct effort to rebuild international institutions along lines first sketched out in the treaty of Westphalia, it is an authentic alternative to globalism and a multi-polar order consistent with American character.

For all these reasons and more, I am grateful to be able to participate in the conference of sovereign nations.

And in honor of the memory of my German babysitter Emilie Betz, and the German literary and scientific tradition that has always set my soul on fire, I am committed to supporting German freedom, sovereignty, and cultural self-determination. You can find my point of view on the significance of the historic German contribution to cultural leadership in my letter to the Justice Minister of Saxony. It is an [Amicus Curiae Brief](#) regarding the imprisonment of Doctor Bianca Witzschel. After serving 476 days in pretrial detention for writing legitimate medical exemptions to a known bioweapon, the 69 year old Dr. Witzschel has now been sent back to jail for 498 more days. We are hoping Secretary Kennedy will intervene, and any help this conference can provide would be transformational for the entire German-speaking region.
